REBUILDING AMERICAN INFRASTRUCTURE WITH SUSTAINABILITY AND EQUITY (RAISE)

Program Summary

The Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity, or RAISE Discretionary Grant program (also known as the Local and Regional Project Assistance Grants), provides funding to invest in road, rail, transit and port projects that promise to achieve national objectives and will have a significant local/regional impact.

RAISE Objective:

- Invest in surface transportation that will have a significant local or regional impact; and
- Support projects that are consistent with the Department's strategic goals: improve safety, economic strength and global competitiveness, equity, and climate and sustainability.

Eligibility

Eligible Applicants

States and the District of Columbia; any territory or possession of the United States; a unit of local government; a public agency or publicly chartered authority established by one or more States; a special purpose district or public authority with a transportation function, including a port authority; a Federally recognized Indian Tribe or a consortium of such Indian Tribes; a transit agency; and a multi-State or multi-jurisdictional group of entities that are separately eligible. Federal agencies are not eligible applicants for the FY 2024 RAISE program.

- Review the NOFO. It will contain the latest information.
- · RAISE is an extremely competitive grant program.
- No more than 15% may be awarded to projects in a single State.
- Not more than 50% of the respective funding shall be awarded to rural projects and not more than 50% of the respective funding shall be awarded to urban projects.
- Each lead applicant may submit no more than three applications. Unrelated project components should not be bundled in a single application for the purpose of adhering to the limit.
- See NOFO for definitions on rural and urban areas.
- If selected for award, the Department may decrease the RAISE funding request amount
 if some elements of the project are ineligible or to comply with statutory set asides such
 as awarding funding evenly between projects located in rural and urban areas.
