FERRY PROGRAMS: PASSENGER FERRY GRANT PROGRAM

Program Summary

Projects funded under the Passenger Ferry Grant Program will improve the condition and quality of existing passenger ferry services, support the establishment of new passenger ferry services, and repair and modernize ferry boats, terminals, and related facilities and equipment.

Note: This program is part of a joint NOFO with the Electric or Low-Emitting Ferry Pilot Program and Ferry Service for Rural Communities Program. An applicant may submit to multiple programs or may choose to submit to only one of the programs. See NOFO for further details.

Eligibility

Eligible Applicants

Designated recipients and eligible direct recipients of Section 5307 funds, States and federally recognized Tribes that operate a public ferry system in an urbanized area.

Eligible Projects

Capital Projects—purchase, construction, replacement, or rehabilitation of ferries, terminals, related infrastructure, and related equipment (including electric or low-emitting ferry vessels and related infrastructure). Operating costs and planning projects are <u>not</u> eligible.

Want to Apply? Here are some important Details

- Register early on grants gov and sam gov to obtain a unique entity identifier.
- Applicants are encouraged to identify scaled funding options in case insufficient funding is available to fund a project at the full requested amount.
- FTA encourages applicants to demonstrate State or local support by including letters of support. Applications that include letters of support will be viewed more favorably than those that do not.
- In FY 2023, FTA received 22 eligible applications from nine States requesting \$208 million in Federal Passenger Ferry Program funds. Seven projects were funded at a total of \$50.1 million.

Max. Federal share for capital projects is 80% of the net project cost.
