<p>This project will construct multi-modal improvements at the US 50/Watt Avenue interchange and on Watt Avenue between Folsom Boulevard and La Riviera Drive. Improvements include modification of the US 50/Watt Avenue freeway interchange to an L-9 partial cloverleaf configuration; construction of a dedicated transitway and related facilities to support the initial working segment of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT); and construction of dedicated bicycle and pedestrian pathways through the interchange to separate these modes from vehicular traffic. The approaches on either side of each bridge will be widened for a distance of up to 200 feet. A six-foot wide pedestrian walkway will be provided on one side of the Kings River structure to safely convey significant pedestrian traffic that traverses the bridge for recreational purposes. 
