Subject: **RELINQUISHMENT RESOLUTIONS**

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

The California Department of Transportation recommends the California Transportation Commission (Commission) approve the relinquishment resolutions, summarized below, that will transfer highway facilities no longer needed for the State Highway System to the local agencies identified in the summary.

## **ISSUE:**

It has been determined that each facility in the specific relinquishment resolution summarized below is not essential to the proper functioning of the State Highway System and may be disposed of by relinquishment. Upon the recording of the approved relinquishment resolutions in the county where the facilities are located, all rights, title and interest of the State in and to the facilities to be relinquished will be transferred to the local agencies identified in the summary. The facilities are safe and drivable. The local authorities have been advised of the pending relinquishments a minimum of 90 days prior to the Commission meeting pursuant to Section 73 of the Streets and Highways Code. Any exceptions or unusual circumstances are described in the individual summaries.

## **RESOLUTIONS:**

Resolution R-3959 – 07-LA-10-PM 32.7  
(Request No. 1264) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Baldwin Park (City) along Route 10 on Francisquito Avenue and Garvey Avenue, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated April 10, 1958, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State, and by letter dated June 5, 2016, agreed to waive the 90-day notice requirement and accept the relinquishment.

Resolution R-3960 – 10-SJ-5-PM R22.5  
(Request No. 16737) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Stockton (City) along Route 5 at French Camp Road, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated January 29, 2008, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expires July 24, 2016.

Resolution R-3961 – 10-SJ-5-PM R22.0/R22.7  
(Request No. 16746) – 6 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the county of San Joaquin (County) along Route 5 between Manthey Road and French Camp Road, consisting of collateral facilities. The County, by freeway agreement dated May 13, 2008, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expires July 21, 2016.

Resolution R-3962 – 11-SD-52-PM 6.9  
(Request No. 25554) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of San Diego (City) along Route 52 at Kearny Villa Road, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated April 8, 1986, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The 90-day notice period expires July 17, 2016.

Resolution R-3963 – 12-Ora-5-PM 34.0/36.9  
(Request No. R120020) – 2 Segments

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Anaheim (City) along Route 5 on Disney Way, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by freeway agreement dated November 9, 1992 and by amendment to freeway agreement dated July 9, 1996, agreed to accept title upon relinquishment by the State. The City, by letter dated May 20, 2016, waived the 90-day notice requirement and agreed to accept the relinquishment.

Resolution R-3964 – 03-Pla-65-PM M8.2  
(Request No. 36798-X) – 1 Segment

Relinquishes right of way in the city of Roseville (City) along Route 65 at Blue Oaks Boulevard, consisting of collateral facilities. The City, by relinquishment agreement dated July 12, 2016, agreed to waive the 90-day notice requirement and accept title upon relinquishment by the State.
