## Key Project Facts

- Four miles of new carpool lanes on Interstate 805 (I-805), one in each direction, between State Route 52 and Mira Mesa Boulevard
- A Direct Access Ramp (DAR) at Carroll Canyon Road providing additional entrance and exit points for the carpool lanes
- Total investment of \$119 million designed to address congestion in the Sorrento Valley area

Promises Made, Promises Kept

The I-805 improvements are funded by the local *TransNet* half-cent sales tax leveraged with state and federal dollars. Over the past three decades, *TransNet* funding has made it possible to complete more than 650 projects and programs totaling more than \$13.7 billion countywide. These include highway, transit, bike and pedestrian infrastructure, habitat conservation, and local street repairs.

Projects funded in part by *TransNet* include: the Interstate 15 Express Lanes, the Mid-Coast Trolley from Old Town to University City, and the North Coast Corridor Program (\$6 billion package of highway, transit, bike, and environmental enhancements along I-5).

## Keep San Diego Moving Forward



In November, voters countywide may be asked whether they support increasing the region's local sales tax by one-half cent. The "Keep San Diego Moving Forward" measure is designed to provide a dedicated source of local revenue to invest in our region's transportation future; these funds can't be taken away by Sacramento. A mix of projects and programs to be funded was prepared based on input from the public, resulting in a balanced plan that includes a variety of transportation system improvements.


