Interstate 680 - Rehabilitation Project Between Fairfield and Benicia Caltrans Completes Construction Ahead of Schedule

SOLANO COUNTY –The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has completed construction of the Interstate 680 (I-680) Rehabilitation Project in Solano County.

The \$13 million project rehabilitates and repaves approximately 13 miles of northbound and southbound I-680 between Fairfield and Benicia and also improves safety for the approximately 100,000 daily motorists traveling this busy route between the Bay Area and Sacramento.

Construction started in spring 2015 with final paving completed in mid-December 2015. Work finished ahead of the original completion date of the first quarter of 2016.

The project resurfaced the two northbound and two southbound traffic lanes of I-680, repaired the existing median metal guardrails, and roadway lighting.
