Public Meeting to Discuss Managed Lane Project Highway 101 in San Mateo County

San Mateo - Caltrans will hold two public meeting in San Mateo County to discuss the proposed Managed Lanes Project that would build a continuous express lane in each direction on Highway 101 between I-380 and Whipple Road in San Mateo County. The carpool lanes between Whipple and San Antonio Road would be converted to express lanes and joined with the newly built lanes, creating two 22-mile express lanes to reduce congestion on Highway 101.

The meetings will follow an open house format during where attendees can view exhibits of project features. Caltrans and its partners will be on hand to provide project details and answer questions.

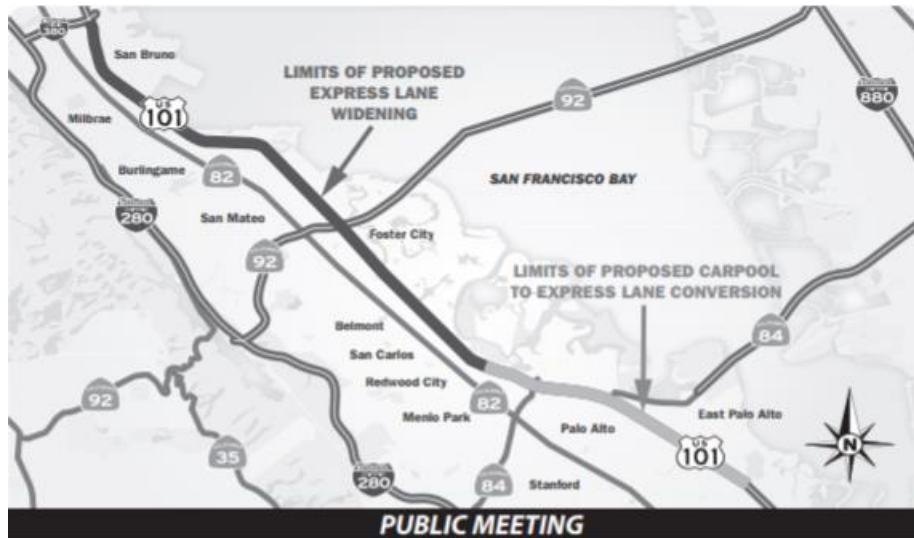

Highway 101 in San Mateo County lacks carpool lane, forcing buses and carpoolers to share lanes with single occupant vehicles. Travel times are increasing, affecting businesses and residents throughout the corridor.

Caltrans released the Draft Environmental Report for this \$500 million project on Monday, November 20, 2017, and is seeking comments until January 19, 2018.

To minimize costs and expedite construction, Caltrans engineers designed the project to remain within the existing right of way.

San Mateo County Transportation Authority, and City/County Association of Governments of San Mateo County have partnered with Caltrans on this project.
