Lane Closures Scheduled on Pacific Coast Highway (State Route 1) In Ventura County for Pavement Project

Completion of \$1.48 Million Contract Expected in July

VENTURA – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) advises the public to expect some temporary lane closures in July on Pacific Coast Highway (State Route 1) in western Ventura County as workers complete a pavement rehabilitation project.

The work extends for six miles along SR-1 from Hobson County Park Road on the north to the SR-1 Solimar undercrossing at US Highway 101 on the south. The project area includes public beaches and the seaside communities of Solimar Beach and Faria Beach.

The project involves removing sections of distressed pavement and grinding the surface of the roadway before crews apply a rubberized asphalt overlay on the entire roadway in both directions. When the work is finished, the result will be a smoother, quieter ride for travelers.

At times, the two-lane highway will be reduced temporarily to a single lane of traffic between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. on weekdays. Flag crews will direct drivers. Some traffic delays should be expected.

People near the highway may experience noise associated with construction activities. Noise levels will not exceed state and federal regulations. The work will be done only during daylight hours and on weekdays. No work is planned at night or on weekends.

The \$1.48 million contract was awarded to Toro Enterprises Inc. of Oxnard. The pavement rehabilitation project is state-funded.

The work is estimated to be finished by the end of July. Construction signs and changeable message signs are in place to alert motorists to construction activities.
