OVERNIGHT PAVEMENT MARKER REPLACEMENT PROJECT ALONG SAN BENITO AND MONTEREY COUNTIES BEGINS SUNDAY NIGHT

SAN BENITO AND MONTEREY COUNTIES – An overnight pavement marker replacement project along Highways 156 and 101 in San Benito and Monterey Counties will begin Sunday night, September 29, Caltrans officials have announced.

The 16-mile project will involve three locations: Hwy. 101 from Monterey to the San Benito County Line. From the junction of the Route 156/101 separation to Alameda Street, and on Hwy. 101 from the Airport Blvd. Overcrossing to the Boronda Rd. Overcrossing.

Overnight work hours will be Sundays through Thursdays from 8:30 pm to 5:30 am and Fridays from midnight to 5:30 am. No closures will take place Saturday nights. Minimal delays are expected.

The pavement markers are replacing damaged or missing markers along the various highways in San Benito and Monterey Counties. Roadwork is expected to be completed by early November, weather permitting.

The contractor for this \$104,000 project is Central Striping Service, Inc. from Rancho Cordova.

Caltrans reminds motorists to move over and slow down when driving through highway construction zones.
