CALTRANS/CHP REMIND MOTORISTS TO DRIVE SAFELY/SHARE THE ROAD DURING THE CALIFORNIA MID-STATE FAIR

SAN LUIS OBISPO COUNTY – Caltrans and the California Highway Patrol (CHP) are reminding motorists to drive safely during the California Mid-State Fair which begins in Paso Robles on Wednesday, July, 20 and during the rest of the summer driving season by taking the following steps:

- Abide by the posted speed limit and reduce your speed in areas where congestion or hazards may occur. Motorists should maintain a safe distance between their vehicle and the one in front of them.
- Slow down and move over when Caltrans workers, law enforcement or tow truck drivers are working near the roadway. The public is encouraged to call 911 to report any hazardous conditions or impaired driving.
- Be aware of electronic message boards and other road signs with information on incidents, changing road conditions, lane closures or detours.
- Make sure that vehicle brakes, windshield wiper blades and tires are in good condition and inspect your head and tail lights for maximum visibility on the highway.
- Share the road safely with other users, especially bicyclists, motorcyclists and pedestrians. The Automobile Association of America predicts vehicle travel will increase 2% this summer.

Caltrans and the CHP are prepared to respond to any emergencies that may affect the state highway system.

No major roadwork/lane closures are scheduled in the Paso Robles area during the California Mid-State Fair which runs from Wednesday, July 20 through Sunday, July 31.
