

Welcome to District 5's Postmile Publication Page



Produced by Headquarters, the **Highway Sequence Listing** is published annually from the Highway Inventory Database and lists highway segments, intersections and ramps. Since the postmiles in this document are to thousandths, it is the exact location of county lines, bridges, intersections and ramps and used for critical postmile location applications.

The following is some of the information provided in this report:

- Location: District, route, county, city and postmile
- Highway group and facility type
- Highway segment length
- Equations
- Description of bridges, intersections and ramps

The **Postmile Book** is a reference book where the postmiles are rounded to hundredths for non-critical applications. The Postmile Book list most of the inventory items found in the Sequence Listing.

There are two types of Postmile Books available, one electronic for your computer's desktop and one for easy two sided printing with all the blanks pages in place so you can tab your three ring binders.

The Postmile Book list items that are not found in the Sequence Listing like:

- Landmarks
- City Blocks
- Nicknames
- Maintenance areas and yards
- Vista Points

- Private Roads
- Relinquishments
- Route Breaks
- Secondary Streets associated with the intersection
- Signalized intersections

All this and more in an easy to reading format makes it quick to locate postmiles in the field and from your desktop.

The **Postmile Book Index** is for printing separate sections of the Postmile Book by county and route. Also you can keep your Postmile Book updated with the Postmile Index. Every section has a will have the latest update date posted with it.

The **California Log of Bridges on State Highways** is a listing of all bridges and other highway structures on California's State Highway System. Each structure is listed in the Log once for each state highway that is carried by or crosses under the structure. Within each district, the structures are listed by state highway route number and are sorted in driving order along each route. The structure entries are interspersed with miscellaneous descriptive information about each route.

Notes:

For Santa Cruz County there is generally a difference between the actual postmile location and the location of the postmile markers in the field. These postmile markers have been in place since 1964 and the accident and highway data have been referenced to them. Due to this long history, the postmile markers will remain unchanged in the field and continue to be used as in the past.
