POMONA FREEWAY (SR-60) LANE CLOSURE SCHEDULE

CITY OF INDUSTRY - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announces the following lane and ramp closures for the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV or carpool) lane construction and pavement replacement project on the Pomona Freeway (SR-60) between the San Gabriel River Freeway (I-605) and Orange Freeway (SR-57). Ramp closures will be staged so that no two consecutive ramps are closed at the same time. The following overnight closure schedule will be in effect, weather permitting:

Eastbound SR-60

Nightly, Wednesday, December 26 through Friday, December 28

- 9 p.m. until 7 a.m. – Up to four lanes from Crossroads Parkway to Hacienda Boulevard.
- 10 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Up to three lanes from Fullerton Road to Nogales Street.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Crossroads Parkway on- and off-ramps.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – 7th Avenue on- and off-ramps.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Hacienda Boulevard on- and off-ramps.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Fullerton Road on- and off-ramps.
- 11 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Nogales Street on- and off-ramps.

Westbound SR-60

Nightly, Wednesday, December 26 through Friday, December 28

- 7 p.m. until 5 a.m. – Up to four lanes from 7th Avenue to Crossroads Parkway.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – 7th Avenue on- and off-ramps.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Crossroads Parkway on- and off-ramps.

SR-60 is one of the most heavily traveled freeways and a main truck route to and from the Ports of Los Angeles and Long Beach. The addition of carpool lanes will alleviate congestion on this route. As part of this project, Caltrans will construct soundwalls to minimize freeway noise, upgrade and reconfigure on- and off-ramps as needed. Completion of the project is estimated for fall 2010. Skanska USA is the project contractor on this \$125 million project. Caltrans advises motorists to “**Slow For The Cone Zone.**”
