ARTESIA FREEWAY (SR-91) CLOSURES

COMPTON - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will close lanes and ramps for the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV or carpool) lane reconstruction and pavement replacement project on the Artesia Freeway (SR-91), from the Harbor Freeway (I-110) to Lakewood Boulevard. One lane will remain open to traffic at all times. The following schedule will be in effect, weather permitting:

Tuesday, February 17

Eastbound SR-91

- 7 p.m. to 7 a.m. – Up to four lanes and the carpool lane from I-110 to Downey Avenue
- 7 p.m. to 6 p.m. – Off- and on-ramps at Main Street
- 7 p.m. to 6 p.m. – Off-ramp at Avalon Boulevard
- 7 p.m. to 6 p.m. – Off-ramp at Atlantic Avenue
- 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. – North- and southbound connectors to I-110

Westbound SR-91

- 6 p.m. to 6 a.m. – Up to four lanes and the carpool lane from Downey Avenue to I-110
- 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. – Connectors to I-710

Friday, February 20

Eastbound SR-91

- 7 p.m. to Noon – Up to four lanes and the carpool lane from I-110 to Downey Avenue
- 7 p.m. to Noon – Off- and on-ramps at Main Street
- 7 p.m. to Noon – Off-ramp at Avalon Boulevard
- 7 p.m. to Noon – Off-ramp at Atlantic Avenue
- 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. – North- and southbound connectors to I-110

Westbound SR-91

- 6 p.m. to Noon – Up to four lanes and the carpool lane from Downey Avenue to I-110
- 9 p.m. to 9 a.m. – Connectors to I-710

ARTESIA FREEWAY (SR-91) LANE CLOSURE SCHEDULE

SR-91 is one of the most heavily traveled freeways in Los Angeles County and was also one of the first freeways to offer carpool lanes. As a result of heavy use, the asphalt pavement has experienced extensive wear. New pavement will improve safety and mobility for motorists. Completion of the entire project, which covers SR-91 from Downey Avenue to Vermont Avenue, is spring 2009. Caltrans advises motorists to **“Slow For The Cone Zone.”**
