## **ARTESIA FREEWAY (SR-91) LANE AND RAMP CLOSURES**

**Los Angeles** - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) announces the following lane and ramp closures for the High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV or carpool) lane reconstruction and pavement replacement project on the westbound Artesia Freeway (SR-91), from the Harbor Freeway (I-110) to Downey Avenue in Bellflower. The following overnight closure schedule will be in effect, weather permitting. At least one lane will remain open to traffic in each direction at all times. Ramp closures will be staged so that no two consecutive ramps are closed at the same time.

### **Eastbound SR-91**

#### **Nightly, Monday, February 4 through Friday, February 8**

- 7 p.m. until 7 a.m. – Up to four lanes and HOV Lane from the Harbor Freeway (I-110) to Wilmington Avenue.
- 8 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Connectors to and from the Long Beach Freeway (I-710).
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Main Street on- and off-ramps.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Avalon Boulevard on- and off-ramps.
- 8 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Central Avenue on- and off-ramps.

### **Westbound SR-91**

#### **Nightly, Monday, February 4 through Friday, February 8**

- 6 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Up to four lanes and the HOV lane from Downey Avenue to Harbor Freeway (I-110).
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Central Avenue on- and off-ramps.
- 7 p.m. until 6 a.m. – Avalon Boulevard on- and off-ramps.

## ARTESIA FREEWAY (SR-91) LANE AND RAMP CLOSURES

SR-91 is one of the most heavily traveled freeways in Los Angeles County and was also one of the first freeways to offer carpool lanes. As a result of heavy use, the asphalt pavement has experienced extensive wear. New pavement will improve safety and mobility for motorists. Completion of the entire project, which covers SR-91 from Downey Avenue to Vermont Avenue, is fall 2008. Caltrans advises motorists to “**Slow For The Cone Zone.**”
