Long Beach Freeway (I-710) Lane and Ramp Closures

NORTH LONG BEACH, CARSON, COMPTON, PARAMOUNT, LYNWOOD, SOUTHGATE –
The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will close portions of the northbound and southbound Long Beach Freeway (I-710) for work on the Long Life Pavement Rehabilitation Project involving median barrier demolition and pipe removal, striping and setting K-rail to ensure that safety of the work crew and motorists throughout the construction.

Sunday, January 20

- 5 a.m. to 11:59 p.m. - up to three lanes northbound I-710 from SR-91 to Alondra Boulevard.
- 5 a.m. to 11:59 p.m. - up to three lanes southbound I-710 from Imperial Highway to Alondra Boulevard.

Nightly; Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, January, 22, 23, 24

- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – up to two lanes southbound I-710 from Alondra Boulevard to SR-91.
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – **Full closure** of the on-ramp at Alondra Boulevard to southbound I-710.
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – **Full closure** of the on-ramp at Del Amo Boulevard to northbound I-710.

Friday, January 25

- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – up to two lanes southbound I-710 from Alondra Boulevard to SR-91.
- 7 p.m. to 10 a.m. – **Full closure** of the on-ramp at Alondra Boulevard to southbound I-710.
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – **Full closure** of the on-ramp at Del Amo Boulevard to northbound I-710.

This \$164.5 million Long Life Pavement Rehabilitation project involves nine miles of the Long Beach Freeway (I-710) stretching from Long Beach to South Gate in both northbound and southbound directions. The work includes pavement replacement, shoulder reconstruction, replacement of the metal median barrier guardrail with concrete barriers, widening of the under crossing at Atlantic Boulevard, a soundwall, and widening of the southbound I-710 at the Compton Creek Bridge. The project is expected to complete in mid-2012.
