## Long Beach Freeway (I-710) Lane Closures

**LONG BEACH** - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will close portions of the northbound and southbound Long Beach Freeway (I-710) for pavement replacement and to replace the metal beam center median with concrete barriers from Ocean Boulevard to Pacific Coast Highway (PCH)/State Route 1 (SR-1). The following schedule will be in effect:

### Overnight, Monday, July 30 through Saturday, August 4 at the Port of Long Beach

- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – Up to two lanes northbound I-710 from Harbor Scenic Drive to Shoreline Drive.
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – Up to two lanes southbound I-710 from Shoreline Drive to Harbor Scenic Drive.

**Detour for all trucks weighing over 3 tons** - Signed detours will be in place directing truck traffic.

### Overnight, Monday, July 30 through Friday, August 3:

- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. - up to four lanes northbound I-710 from Shoreline Drive to PCH (SR-1).
- 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. - up to three lanes southbound I-710 from PCH (SR- 1) to Shoreline Drive.
- 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. – northbound and southbound I-710 on- and off-ramps at Shoreline Drive.

### Overnight, Friday, August 3:

- 9 p.m. to 7 a.m. - up to three lanes southbound I-710 from PCH (SR-1) to Shoreline Drive.
- 7 p.m. to 9 a.m. – up to four lanes northbound I-710 Shoreline Drive to PCH (SR-1).
- 11 p.m. to 8 a.m. – northbound and southbound I-710 on- and off-ramps at Shoreline Drive.

### Overnight, Saturday, August 4:

- 7 p.m. to 9 a.m. – up to four lanes northbound I-710 from Shoreline Drive to PCH (SR-1).
- 9 p.m. to 7 a.m. – up to three lanes southbound I-710 from PCH (SR-1) to Shoreline Drive.
- 11 p.m. to 6 a.m. – southbound I-710 off-ramp at Shoreline Drive.
- 1 a.m. to 8 a.m. – northbound I-710 on-ramp at Shoreline Drive.

All American Asphalt is the contractor of this \$5.6 million project that is estimated to complete in fall of 2008. The benefits of this pavement improvement project are a smoother driving surface and an extended life span of the road.

For the safety of work crews on the freeway, Caltrans reminds the public to please “Slow for the Cone Zone.”
