POMONA FREEWAY (SR-60) RESTORATION LANE CLOSURES

LOS ANGELES - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will close portions of SR-60 between the Orange Freeway (SR-57) and Corona Freeway (SR-71) for pavement work. One lane will remain open to traffic at all times; no two consecutive ramps will be closed at the same time. Detours will be posted. Closures are as follows, weather permitting.

Monday, May 9 through Wednesday, May 11

Westbound SR-60

- 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. – Up to three lanes and the carpool lane from Reservoir Street to Diamond Bar Boulevard, SR-57
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – Phillips Ranch Road and Garey Avenue on- and off-ramps
- 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. – Connectors to and from northbound and southbound SR-71

Thursday, May 12

Westbound SR-60

- 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. – Up to five lanes and the carpool lane from SR-71 to Diamond Bar Boulevard, SR-57
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – Phillips Ranch Road and Garey Avenue on- and off-ramps
- 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. – Connectors to and from north- and southbound SR-57

Friday, May 13

Westbound SR-60

- 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. – Up to five lanes from SR-71 to Diamond Boulevard, SR-57
- 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. – Grand Avenue off-ramp
- 7 p.m. to 9 a.m. – Diamond Bar Boulevard on- and off-ramps
- 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. – Connector from southbound SR-57

Saturday, May 14

Westbound SR-60

- 8 p.m. to 9 a.m. – Up to five lanes from Diamond Bar Boulevard to Grand Avenue, SR-57
- 10 p.m. to 9 a.m. – Diamond Bar Boulevard on- and off-ramps
- 9 p.m. to 8 a.m. – Connector from southbound SR-57

SR-60 is a major thoroughfare serving commuters and large commercial vehicles. As a result of heavy use, the asphalt pavement has experienced extensive wear. New pavement will improve safety and mobility for motorists. Chumo Construction is the contractor on this \$32 million project which is expected to complete winter 2012.
