LANE CLOSURES ANNOUNCED ON CENTURY FREEWAY (I-105), SAN DIEGO FREEWAY (I-405) AND IMPERIAL HIGHWAY 8/25 & 8/26

LOS ANGELES – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) announces the following freeway and street closures. Motorists are advised to seek alternate routes during the specified dates and times.

Eastbound Century Freeway (I-105) Weekend of August 25 & 26

- 3 a.m. until 11:59 p.m. – Full freeway closure of eastbound I-105 between Sepulveda Boulevard and La Cienega Boulevard.
- 3 a.m. until 11:59 p.m. – I-105 connectors to I-405.

Westbound Century Freeway (I-105) Weekend of August 25 & 26

- 6 a.m. until 8 p.m. – Intermittent traffic breaks on I-105 between I-405 and Sepulveda Boulevard.
- 6 a.m. until 8 p.m. - Intermittent traffic breaks on I-405 connector to the westbound I-105.

Harbor Freeway (I-110) and Century Freeway (I-105) Connectors, weekend of August 25 & 26

- 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. – Full closure of southbound I-110 High Occupancy Vehicle (carpool) connectors to the eastbound and westbound I-105 carpool lanes.
- 5 a.m. until 9 p.m. – Full closure of eastbound and westbound I-105 High Occupancy Vehicle (carpool) connectors to the northbound I-110.
