LANE CLOSURES ANNOUNCED ON CENTURY FREEWAY (I-105) AND IMPERIAL HIGHWAY

LOS ANGELES – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the Los Angeles Department of Transportation announce lane closures on Century Freeway (SR-105) and Imperial Highway.

Century Freeway (I-105)

November 4, 5, 11, 12, 2006

- 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. – Eastbound I-105 between Sepulveda Boulevard and La Cienega Boulevard intermittent closures. Westbound I-105 expect intermittent freeway delays.
- 4 a.m. until 7 a.m. – East- and westbound I-105 between Sepulveda Boulevard and La Cienega Boulevard full closure on November 5 and 12.
- 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. – Eastbound I-105 north- and southbound connectors to the San Diego Freeway (I-405) expect intermittent closures.

Imperial Highway

Thursday, November 2, 2006 through Friday, November 3, 2006

- 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. – One lane in each direction on Imperial Highway between Aviation Boulevard and Nash Street will be closed.

November 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 2006

- Full closure eastbound Imperial Highway between Nash Street and Aviation Boulevard between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. and weekends from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.. Exceptions to this schedule will be

LANE CLOSURES ANNOUNCED ON CENTURY FREEWAY (I-105) AND IMPERIAL HIGHWAY

- November 5 and November 12 when closure will take place between 4 a.m. and 7 a.m..
Full closure westbound Imperial Highway between Aviation Boulevard and Nash Street weekdays between 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. and weekends 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Exceptions to this schedule will be November 5 and November 12 when closure will take place between 4 a.m. and 7 a.m..

Nash Street – From Atwood Way to Imperial Highway, Nash Street will be made to run in two directions to allow traffic to travel north for access to Imperial Highway and get to LAX from Douglas Street. Police officers, cones and barricades will be used to accomplish this task.
