

WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) lead agency in the preparation of an Initial Study/Environmental Assessment (IS/EA) for the Navy Drive Bridge Replacement Project, as assigned by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). The Port of Stockton is designated as the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The Navy Drive Bridge Replacement Project includes the following components:

- Replacement and widening of the San Joaquin River Bridge (No. 29C-0023) on Navy Drive to Address existing functional structural and functional deficiencies and to accommodate projected growth at the Port
- Construction of a removable center bridge span to comply with US Coast Guard requirements
- Realignment and widening of the bridge roadway approaches
- Relocation of the existing access road to the City of Stockton Police Training Facility

WHY THIS PUBLIC NOTICE?

Caltrans and the Port of Stockton have studied the effects this project may have on the environment. Our studies show it will not significantly affect the quality of the environment. This notice is to inform you of the preparation of the IS/EA and its availability for you to read and comment on during a review period beginning between April 15, 2013, and ending May 15, 2013. Due to the time limits mandated by federal and state law, your response must be received no later than May 15, 2013.
