## Notice of Intent

### To Adopt National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Supplement [Particulate Matter (PM) 10 and 2.5 Hot Spot Assessment] for the South Stockton 6-Lane Project

#### WHAT IS BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), in cooperation with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the San Joaquin County Council of Governments propose to widen State Route 99 from 0.4 miles north of the Arch Road Interchange to 0.11 miles south of the State Route 4 (Crosstown Freeway) Interchange in the city of Stockton. The project proposes to add two lanes and improve interchanges, with some improvements to local streets. The purpose of the project is to increase capacity, and improve traffic operations and safety, along with providing route continuity for State Route 99 and State Route 4.

#### WHY THIS PROJECT?

A project-level conformity analysis shows that the project will conform with the State Implementation Plan, including the localized impact analysis for Carbon Monoxide (CO) and Particulate Matter (PM 10 and PM 2.5) as required by 40 CFR 93.116 and 93.123. This project is considered a Project of Air Quality Concern regarding particulate matter (PM 10 and PM 2.5) as defined in 40 CFR 93.123 (b)(1). A detailed PM 10 and PM 2.5 hot spot analysis was completed, as required by 40 CFR 93.116 and 93.123.
