

ALTERNATIVE 9 – EXISTING STATE ROUTE 108

Length: 21.4 miles

Cost: \$1.411 billion

Purpose and Need: This alternative meets project Purpose and Need.

Relocations/Acreage: 1,361 parcels, 914 building structures which include 597 commercial buildings, 570 urban acres, and 357 rural acres would be affected.

Excessive Construction Cost: The construction cost for this alternative would exceed \$1.2 billion as identified for the project in the 2011 RTP. In addition, it would require a high number of relocations and parcel acquisition, which would add to the total project cost.

Severe Operational or Safety Problems: The existing density of adjacent development could result in operational and safety problems.

Unacceptable Adverse Social, Economic, or Environmental Impacts: This alternative would disrupt and divide an existing community and result in economic and social impacts to residents and businesses.

Combination of Reasons which taken Individually may not be Significant but Would be Significant Cumulatively: Cumulative impacts would result due to relocations, operational and safety problems, and social, economic, and environmental impacts.

Previously Rejected at an Earlier Stage in the Planning Process: No

Recommendation: This alternative is not recommended for future consideration because it does not satisfy all of the screening criteria. The total construction cost for this alternative exceeds the amount identified in 2011 RTP. In addition, it would require a high number of relocations and parcel acquisition and have high economic, social, and cumulative impacts.
