





Project Description and Purpose

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), in cooperation with the Stanislaus Council of Governments (StanCOG), Stanislaus County, and the City of Modesto, proposes to construct a four-lane freeway/expressway on a new alignment from State Route 99 just south of Kansas Avenue to Dakota Avenue. This project includes a new SR132 to SR99 interchange connection.

The purpose of the project is to construct a freeway/expressway to address traffic congestion and safety on SR-132.
