



Frequently Asked Questions

What is The State Route 120/Mc Kinley Avenue Interchange Project?

The State Route 120 (SR-120)/McKinley Avenue Interchange Project will construct new on and off-ramps to provide access to and from the freeway. The project will also widen McKinley Avenue within the project area, provide auxiliary lanes on SR-120 between Airport Way and McKinley Avenue, and provide sidewalks and bicycle lanes.

Who is Responsible for this Project?

The San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) is the lead agency for design, working in partnership with Caltrans, the lead agency for construction, as well as the City of Manteca and San Joaquin County.

What is The Purpose of This Project?

SR-120 serves traffic within the Manteca area and interregional traffic between the Central Valley and the Bay Area. The project will help to reduce congestion; improve traffic circulation; and enhance safety for motorists, bicyclists, and pedestrians.

What Is The Project Cost and How Is This Project Being Funded?

The \$46 million project was included in the Federal SAFETEA-LU bill as High Priority Program Project No. 1775, and received a federal earmark to help fund the planning and design. Right-of-way acquisition and construction will be funded by a combination of local, regional, and state funds.
