What is the State Route 99/State Route 219 Kiernan Avenue Interchange Reconstruction Project?

The State Route 99/State Route 219 Kiernan Avenue Interchange Reconstruction Project is located in unincorporated Stanislaus County near Salida. It is expected to reduce the growing rate of traffic congestion at the interchange and is scheduled for completion in early summer 2016.

What is included in the project?

Planned improvements include the following primary improvements:

- Replacing the existing bridge, as well as the on- and off-ramps.
- Constructing a new auxiliary lane in each direction on SR-99 from Kiernan Avenue to Pelandale Avenue.
- Adding a lane in each direction on Kiernan Avenue.
- Providing improved operations for turning movements to and from SR-99.
- Constructing associated local road improvements at Sisk Road and Salida Boulevard.
- Constructing a storm drain pump station and collection system.

Why is this project needed?

When completed, the reconstructed interchange will help meet future traffic demands, alleviate traffic congestion, and improve the overall operation of the busy interchange. Increasing the efficiency of SR99/SR219 Kiernan Avenue will also encourage the free flow of goods and services for the region and the state.
