TRAFFIC ADVISORY STATE ROUTE 99 FROM AUSTIN ROAD TO STATE ROUTE 4/CROSSTOWN FREEWAY IN SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY

San Joaquin County – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will perform various road construction and maintenance activities on State Route 99 (SR-99) from Austin Road to Arch Road. No two consecutive ramps will close at the same time. Work will occur as follows:

- The left shoulder, median and #1(left) lane on northbound and southbound SR-99 from Austin Road to Arch Road will close Sunday, September 21, 2014 through Friday, September 26, 2014 from 7:00 p.m. until at 6:00 a.m.;
- The southbound off-ramp from SR-99 to Austin Road will close beginning Sunday, September 21, 2014 through Friday September 26, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The connector ramp from northbound and southbound SR-99 at SR-120/ Manteca Bypass will close beginning Sunday, September 21, 2014 through Friday, September 26, 2014 from 9:00 p.m. until 4:00 a.m.
- The southbound off-ramp from SR-99 to Main Street in Manteca will close beginning Sunday, September 21, 2014, through Friday, September 26, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The northbound and southbound on and off-ramps on SR-99 from Lathrop Road to Main Street in Stockton will alternately close beginning Sunday, September 21, 2014, through Friday, September 26, 2014, from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The northbound off-ramp from SR-99 to French Camp Road is closed and scheduled to reopen spring 2015;
- The #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes on southbound SR-99 from SR-4 West/ Crosstown Freeway to Arch Road will alternately close beginning Sunday, September 21, 2014, through Friday, September 26, 2014, from 10:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.
