## **TRAFFIC ADVISORY INTERSTATE 5 FROM STANISLAUS/MERCED COUNTY LINE TO STANISLAUS/SAN JOAQUIN COUNTY**

**Stanislaus County** – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will be performing a variety of road-related work on Interstate 5 from the Stanislaus/Merced County line to the Stanislaus/San Joaquin County line. **(No work is scheduled for the Thanksgiving holiday from Wednesday evening, November 25, 2015, through Sunday evening, November 29, 2015.)**

Work will occur as follows:

- The northbound #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes will alternately close for pavement work from the Stanislaus/Merced County line to the Del Puerto Creek Undercrossing (north of Sperry Avenue) beginning Sunday, November 22, 2015, through Wednesday, November 25, 2015, from 8:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.;
- The southbound #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes will alternately close for pavement work from Sperry Avenue to the Stanislaus/Merced County line beginning Sunday, November 22, 2015, through Wednesday, November 25, 2015, from 7:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.;
- The northbound #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes will alternately close for pavement work from the Stanislaus/Merced County line to the Stanislaus/San Joaquin County line beginning Monday, November 23, 2015, through Tuesday, November 24, 2015, from 10:00 a.m. until 5 p.m.;
- The southbound #1 (left) and #2 (right) lanes will alternately close for pavement work from the Stanislaus/Merced County line to the Stanislaus/San Joaquin County line beginning Monday, November 23, 2015, through Tuesday, November 24, 2015, from 8:30 a.m. until 2:30 p.m.;

- Various northbound on and off-ramps will be closed for striping from State Route 140 to Sperry Avenue beginning Monday, November 23, 2015, through Tuesday, November 24, 2015 from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. No two consecutive ramps will be closed.

Motorists should expect 15 minute delays and seek alternate routes.

This work is scheduled to begin as listed, but is subject to change due to traffic incidents, weather, availability of equipment and/ or materials and construction related issues.

This is part of the Interstate 5 Repaving and Rehabilitation Project, a \$51 million effort that will repave 40 miles of I-5 in Merced, Stanislaus and San Joaquin counties. Work began in April 2015 and is scheduled to finish in April 2016. The project extends from Tom Paine Slough in San Joaquin County, just north of the I-205 interchange, to just south of the Merced/Stanislaus County line. The project also is installing in-ground detections loops and paving on and off-ramps so they conform smoothly with local roads.
