CLOSURE OF STATE ROUTE 241 ANTONIO PARKWAY TO SANTA MARGARITA PARKWAY WEEK OF NOVEMBER 10, 2014

Rancho Santa Margarita to Irvine—The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) continues a pavement overlay project along the northbound and southbound SR-241 from Rancho Santa Margarita to Irvine. Full closures are planned along the mainline and various On-ramps beginning Wednesday, November 12th through Saturday, November 15, 2014 late night to early morning hours. Crews will continue grinding and paving operations. Detours will be posted to alert motorists. Consecutive ramps in the same direction of travel will not be closed.
