## EMERGENCY CLOSURE CARBON CANYON ROAD (SR-142) 56 HOURS APRIL 4 - 7, 2014

**Brea/Chino Hills** - The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has announced a full closure of Carbon Canyon Road (SR-142) in both directions from Valencia Avenue to Olinda Drive for the installation of cable mesh on the hillside due to the recent earthquake, starting 9:00 p.m. Friday, April 4 through 4:00 a.m. Monday, April 7, 2014.

Crews are currently working on the hillside and a full weekend closure is required to safely install the cable mesh. Permanent and portable changeable message signs will be used to alert motorists. Motorists are advised to use an alternate route this weekend.

Detours are as follows:

- Eastbound SR-91 to SR-71
- Westbound SR-91 to SR-57
- Northbound SR-57 to Eastbound SR-60 to Southbound SR-71
- Northbound SR-71 to Westbound SR-60 to Southbound SR-57

Caltrans takes the safety of the public, employees, and contractors very seriously. The complete closure of the highway is necessary to establish a safety zone for our workers. We appreciate your patience and understanding while this project is being completed.
