Closures of SB I-5 & SB SR-57 connectors to SR-22 Saturday, July 7 from 7:00 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.

Irvine—The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will be conducting emergency closures on Saturday, July 7th from 7:00 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at the following locations:

- Southbound Interstate 5 Chapman Avenue On-ramp
- Southbound Interstate 5 off-ramp at Bristol Street/La Veta Avenue
- Southbound Interstate 5 connector to Eastbound State Route 22
- Southbound Interstate 5 connector to Westbound State Route 22
- Southbound State Route 57 connector to Eastbound State Route 22

Changeable message signs and detour signs will be in place to alert motorists of the closures.

Detours:

- Southbound I-5 to Eastbound or Westbound SR-22
 - Exit Main Street/Broadway
 - Left to North Main Street
 - Right on Town & Country Road to Eastbound or Westbound SR-22
- Or
 - Exit Chapman Avenue
 - Right on Chapman Avenue
 - Right on City Drive to Eastbound or Westbound SR-22
- Southbound Interstate 5 off-ramp at Bristol Street/La Veta Avenue
 - Exit Main Street/Broadway
 - Left to North Main Street to La Veta Avenue
- Southbound SR-57 to Eastbound SR-22
 - Exit Chapman Avenue
 - Right on Chapman Avenue
 - Right on City Drive to Eastbound or Westbound SR-22
- Or
 - Take I-5 South
 - Exit Main Street/Broadway
 - Left to North Main Street
 - Right on Town & Country Road to Eastbound SR-22
