




State Route 142 | Carbon Canyon Road

CALTRANS DISTRICT 12 / FACT SHEET RESURFACING ASPHALT CONCRETE PROJECT



Project Description

State Route 142, Carbon Canyon, two lane roadway (one lane in each direction), is a secondary connector for traveling motorist from Orange County, Los Angeles, and San Bernardino County. For many years, State Route 142 has been a gateway to businesses within the City of Brea.

The project contractor will be All American Asphalt. The project cost estimate is 1.6 million for Capital Preventative Maintenance which includes Resurfacing Asphalt Concrete (AC) in both directions. Anticipated completion date is late September 2012.

The work being done is to preserve and extend the pavement life to provide a smoother surface that greatly enhances the ride quality along State Route 142.

MOTORISTS DETOUR: No detours required.

ADDITIONAL INFO: The timeframe of this project will cover two holidays (Fourth of July and Labor Day). However, per Caltrans holiday restrictions, there will be no closures (work performed) for this project from Tuesday 7/3 at 1:00 p.m. to Thursday 7/5 at 10:00p.m. for the Fourth of July holiday and Friday, 8/31 at 1:00p.m. to Tuesday 9/4 at 10:00 p.m. for the Labor Day holiday.

Project Details

The purpose of the project is to resurface with AC in both directions at post-mile 2.5/6.3 and other miscellaneous related work. The work will be performed on weeknights from 9:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. The contractor will also be working four weekends with tentative dates of 7/14, 7/21, 7/28 and 8/04. The weekend work schedule will be between 9:00 am to 8:00 p.m. Caltrans will provide any necessary updates to this schedule in advance.
