STATE ROUTE 1 (PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY) EMERGENCY REPAIR PROJECT AT CRYSTAL COVE

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will be conducting a storm damage emergency repair project on southbound State Route 1 (Pacific Coast Highway) in the city of Laguna Beach near Crystal Cove State Park, beginning the week of November 29, 2010.

Due to stormwater runoff from multiple rainy seasons, the embankment has deteriorated, causing the roadway to become unstable. Caltrans crews will be constructing two earth retaining structures to protect and stabilize the existing damaged and eroded embankment. This will prevent the loss of the roadway shoulder/bicycle lane.

The roadway shoulder/bicycle lane will be closed for approximately two-tenths of a mile during construction, and bicyclists are advised to share the Number 2 southbound lane during this time. No other closures will be in effect and vehicle traffic will not be impacted. Work hours will be from 10pm to 5am, Sunday through Friday. This project is expected to be completed by the spring of 2012

As always, to ensure the safety of workers and the traveling public, in a construction zone, please remember to “*slow for the cone zone*”, be alert, and proceed with caution.
