## STATE ROUTE 1 (PACIFIC COAST HIGHWAY) FULL LANE CLOSURES AT BOLSA BAY FOR EMERGENCY REPAIR

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will close the northbound #1 and #2 lanes on State Route 1 (Pacific Coast Highway) one half mile south of Warner Avenue, in the city of Huntington Beach on **Friday, August 21, 2009 from 9am to 1pm**. Traffic in the northbound direction will detour off of PCH at Golden West, route north to Warner Ave., and then west along Warner to return to PCH.

This closure is necessary for Caltrans to install long-term temporary K-Rail on the shoulder area until permanent metal beam guard rail (MBGR) can be installed. Caltrans is awaiting approval from the California Coastal Commission for a permit to install the MBGR to complete the project. The permit approval process may take up to one year.

The emergency project consisted of Caltrans crews rebuilding the embankment by installing a steel-plated sea wall to fully support the shoulder pavement after experiencing a loss of asphalt due to erosion.

As always, to ensure the safety of workers and the traveling public, in a construction zone, please remember to *“slow for the cone zone”*, be alert, and proceed with caution.
