## State Route 91 Pavement Rehabilitation State Route 39 - Beach Boulevard to Stanton Undercrossing

**Irvine**—The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will commence a State Highway Operations Protection Program (SHOPP) to resurface the Westbound State Route 91 from Beach Boulevard Undercrossing to Stanton Avenue Undercrossing in Buena Park the Week of October 1, 2012.

This construction project will remove existing asphalt concrete pavement and replace it with open graded asphalt concrete on the mainline of traffic from Tuesday, October 1st 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. Sunday until completion. Full ramp closures will occur 12:00 a.m. to 5:00 a.m.

As the project progresses, the Westbound Beach Boulevard loop onramp will undergo resurfacing. The Department will notify residents, businesses and elected officials of the loop onramp resurfacing schedule and approved detour once the date has been determined. The anticipated project completion date is December 28, 2012.

Additional improvements include the installation of new guardrail, upgrading sidewalks and lighting.

Every effort will be made to minimize the impacts of construction to motorists, residents, and businesses. Changeable message and detour signs will be posted.

Once this project is complete, motorists will notice an improved roadway surface and smoother ride.
