


# Wet Pavement Project

*Beginning in June 2011, the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will begin a project to improve safety along State Route 17 (SR-17) from .1 mile south of Summit Road to 1 mile south of Bear Creek Road overcrossing, in Santa Clara County.*

*The project will construct drainage systems and resurface the existing pavement in order to reduce wet pavement related accidents during wet weather conditions. The entire pavement in both directions southbound and northbound lanes will be resurfaced. In addition, the median concrete barrier and the outside metal beam guard rails (MBGR) will be upgraded.*

*Construction activities will occur at night Monday through Sunday. During the weekdays, work will typically begin at 9:00 p.m. and end at 6:00 a.m. the following day. Weekend work will start as early as 9:00 p.m. and end as late as 10:00 a.m. the following day. Residents should be aware that construction noise will be inevitable; however, it will be kept within approved construction noise levels. Construction area signs and detour signs will be in place to assist and direct motorists traveling through the area. Flaggers will control traffic during construction activities as required to guide motorists through the construction zone.

We appreciate your understanding and patience during this construction and we will work diligently to minimize impacts to residents and motorists during this project. These upgrades to SR-17 along this stretch of highway will result in a safer and smoother drive for the travelling public.
