



Highway 131 Pavement Resurfacing Marin County – Tiburon

The California Department of Transportation began a pavement resurfacing project July 6 on State Route 131 (Tiburon Blvd.) in Tiburon that will impact night traffic. The work will be completed in late September; however, it is weather dependent and inclement weather may impact the anticipated completion date.

Construction activities on SR 131 will be from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. The project limits are 0.2 miles west of the US 101 and SR 131 Interchange to Mar West Street in Tiburon. Motorists are advised to use caution while traveling through the construction area.

The project includes pothole and crack repair, shoulder backing, placing rubberized asphalt, replacing traffic sensors and restriping over a four-mile stretch of highway. Grinding and paving is scheduled to begin July 16, starting at the US 101/SR 131 separation, moving east and will continue 3-4 nights at each intersection. Noise is unavoidable and levels will be high during construction because of the type of construction machinery used to perform the operation. Caltrans will make every effort to keep noise levels to a minimum and implement dust control measures.

In addition, the traffic sensors at signalized intersections will have to be deactivated during the grinding and paving. Traffic lights will be set on a preset timing pattern. Residents should expect delays during the three to six days it will take to replace the sensors at each location.

At least one-lane will open to traffic from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. on the two-lane segment of SR 131. Caltrans will use flaggers from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday and 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. Saturday and Sunday on the one one-lane segment of SR 131 to provide at least one-lane of through traffic.
