

NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSIDER
RESCINDING FREEWAY ADOPTION



WHAT'S BEING PLANNED

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is proposing to rescind the adopted freeway covering the previously approved new freeway alignment project on State Route 238 known as the Hayward Bypass. The limits are from Industrial Parkway to I-580 in the City of Hayward, in Alameda County. The rescission of this freeway adoption will allow Caltrans to sell parcels of land originally purchased for the construction of the Hayward Bypass to local government agencies or other interested parties.

WHAT'S AVAILABLE

A report, Notice of Intent to Consider Rescinding Freeway Adoption, has been presented to and approved by the California Transportation Commission (CTC) last December 9, 2009. The report analyzed the original intent and plans for the construction of freeway segment and the subsequent determination that the construction of the freeway segment by Caltrans is not feasible. This report is intended to assist the California Transportation Commission (CTC) in their decision-making process.
