I-80 Eastbound HOV Lane Project Lane and Ramp Closures Continue This Week

Hercules – As part of the Interstate 80 Eastbound HOV Lane project, which will extend the carpool lane from State Route 4 to the Carquinez Bridge, Caltrans has scheduled lane and ramp closures for eastbound Interstate 80 beginning tonight.

There will be various lane closures on for eastbound I-80 between State Route 4 and the Cummings Skyway off-ramp, for sign installation, **Tuesday night**, February 8, and **Wednesday night**, February 9, from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Eastbound Interstate 80 connector ramp to eastbound State Route 4/ eastbound Willow Avenue off-ramp, will be closed for pavement marker replacement, **Tuesday night**, February 8, from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Eastbound I-80 Cummings Skyway off-ramp will be closed for sign installation, **Tuesday night**, February 8, from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. **Detour:** Take the Pomona St. off-ramp, turn right on San Pablo Ave, continue on San Pablo Ave. to Cummings Skyway and turn left.

Eastbound I-80 Crockett off-ramp will be closed for sign installation, **Wednesday night**, February 9, from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. **Detour:** Exit at Cummings Skyway, turn left on Cummings Skyway, right on San Pablo Avenue, and continue to Pomona Street.

Eastbound I-80 Willow Avenue off-ramp will be closed **Friday**, February 11, from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m. This closure is necessary in order to pour concrete for the new bridge deck. **Detour:** Take the eastbound State Route 4 off-ramp and then exit to Willow Ave.

Eastbound I-80 Willow Avenue off-ramp will be closed for bridge joint repair, **Friday night**, February 11, from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Note: a separate project has also scheduled a closure of the eastbound I-80 Crockett on-ramp for bridge painting on **Friday**, February 11, from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. Detour to the Cummings Skyway on-ramp during this closure.
