



DEVIL'S SLIDE TUNNELS & BRIDGES

THE PROJECT SETTING BEGINS AT A LOCATION 1.5 MILES SOUTH OF THE CITY OF PACIFICA ON THE COAST HIGHWAY.

THE INLAND PORTION OF THE PROJECT AREA CROSSES A VALLEY AT SHAMROCK RANCH. THE VALLEY FLOOR CONSISTS OF IRRIGATED HORSE PASTURES.

A NEW 2-LANE ROADWAY CROSSES OVER THE SHAMROCK RANCH VALLEY VIA TWO SINGLE-LANE BRIDGES FOR A DISTANCE OF APPROXIMATELY 1200 FEET TO THE NEW NORTH TUNNEL PORTALS.

THE TWIN TUNNELS EXTEND ROUTE 1 THROUGH SAN PEDRO MOUNTAIN FOR A DISTANCE OF APPROXIMATELY 4100 FEET TO THE SOUTH PORTALS ON THE PACIFIC COASTLINE.

SAN PEDRO MOUNTAIN IS GENERALLY COVERED WITH GREEN SHRUBS AND COASTAL GRASSES.

HIGHWAY 1 TRAVELS ALONG THE WESTERLY FACE OF SAN PEDRO MOUNTAIN AT 300 FEET ABOVE SEA LEVEL. THIS IS THE LOCATION OF THE DEVIL'S SLIDE.

THE LENGTH OF EXISTING HIGHWAY 1, BETWEEN THE NORTH AND SOUTH PORTALS, WILL BE CONVERTED TO HIKING AND BIKING TRAILS. VISITORS TO THE TRAIL MAY PARK THEIR VEHICLES AT THE NEW VISITOR PARKING CUL DE SAC LOCATED NEAR THE NEW DEVIL'S SLIDE BRIDGES.
