



DEVIL'S SLIDE TUNNELS & BRIDGES



The south project setting is located just north of the town of Montara where Route 1 continues southward towards McNee Ranch State Park, Grey Whale Cove State Beach, and Montara State Beach.

The south project includes two tunnel bores, each with a single lane of traffic in one direction with shoulders and raised sidewalks for emergencies and maintenance personnel access.

The operations and maintenance center will be located approximately 1000 feet south of the south portal on a portion of a disposal site for excavated tunnel material.

A large rock-cut at the south portal area is planned to align the highway and to provide adequate site distance. The face of the large rock-cut is designed to match the appearance of existing rock-cuts in the immediate area.

Visitors to the south portal development area will be able to park their vehicles into two small parking lots adjacent to Route 1 overlooking spectacular views of the Pacific Ocean. Visitors may proceed onto the new hiking and biking trail from this point.

The portals are designed to blend into the surrounding environment with a minimum protrusion of one meter from the face of the mountain. The outer textures and colors of the portal are designed to mimic the existing rock outcroppings of the area.

The adjacent surrounding landscape design for the portals will also mimic the existing vegetation and rock outcroppings of the south portal site.
