U.S. 101 in Sonoma County Northbound Ramp Meters to Go Green October 7, 2014

SONOMA COUNTY – In October the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will activate ramp metering on northbound U.S. 101 in Sonoma County.

Northbound Activation

In the first stage in September, ramp metering was activated for southbound U.S. 101 in Sonoma County. In the next stage of ramp meter activation, meters at 18 on-ramps will be activated on northbound U.S. 101 from Gravenstein Highway in Cotati to Shiloh Road in Windsor.

- Beginning Tuesday, October 7, 2014, on-ramp meters on northbound U.S. 101 will be set to solid green during commute times to alert drivers to the new driving condition.
- On Tuesday, October 14, 2014, on-ramp meters will cycle through red and green during the morning commute hours, from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. On-ramp metering lights will remain green during afternoon commute hours from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.
- On Tuesday, October 21, 2014, on-ramp meters during the afternoon commute will also cycle through red and green. On-ramp metering lights on northbound U.S. 101 will continue to be operational Monday through Friday, from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. in the morning, and from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. in the afternoon.

What is Ramp Metering?

Ramp metering is a traffic management strategy using traffic signals and accompanying equipment and techniques to manage on-ramp flow on the freeway system. It is intended to improve the safety of vehicle merging and the flow of traffic on the highway.

Motorists at newly activated ramp locations may experience operational delays during the first few days of operation. Caltrans staff will monitor the metered locations and make adjustments, and then fine tune the metering operations.

Drivers entering U.S. 101 where on-ramp meters are activated should stop at red and

wait until the metering light turns green to enter U.S. 101. Caltrans will monitor traffic conditions and operate ramp meters as appropriate.

Additional Information

Many of the on-ramps in Sonoma County have a carpool lane marked with a diamond. The carpool lane restriction for an on-ramp is 24-hours per day, seven days a week.
