

Highway 9

Safety Improvement Project



Beginning on April 6, 2009 the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will begin a safety improvement project on Highway 9 that will impact traffic in the area.

Construction will be from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Fridays. One-way reversing traffic control will be in effect during construction. Flaggers, at each end of the construction zone, will work in tandem with a pilot car to safely direct traffic through the area.

Pedestrians, motorists and bicyclists are advised to use caution when traveling through the construction area.



The daytime work is scheduled to end on May 31, 2009 but there could be some delays if it rains, as dry pavement is needed to successfully perform this operation.

The project will install centerline rumble strips as well as roadside signs promoting bicycle and pedestrian safety. The project limits on Highway 9 will be from the Santa Clara County line to 6th Street in Saratoga.

Because of construction equipment and ground-in indentations, required for the installation of rumble strips, noise-levels will be high in certain areas.

We truly appreciate your understanding and patience during this construction and will diligently work to minimize impacts and traffic delays from this project.
