DISTRICT 4 SMALL BUSINESS PROGRAM 2012 ACTIVITY REPORT

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The award-winning Caltrans District 4 Small Business Program (SBP) continues to thrive and reach new heights with innovation and creativity, always looking for new ways to promote, educate and assist Small Business Enterprises (SBEs), Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBES) and Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs) in doing business with Caltrans. District 4 has been and continues to lead and model the way. While this report does not capture all of the work done by the SBP, it does highlight activities in the following areas: Small Business Training and Development; Small Business Community Outreach; Project-specific Outreach; Advocacy; Hosted Events; Coordination & Oversight; and Awards.

SBP developed a number of partnerships in 2012. In the training and development efforts, we partnered with the USDOT's Small Business Transportation Resource Center for the SBTRC Bonding Education Program. During community outreach, SBP partnered with Business Matchmaking; Assemblyman Paul Fung; the Business Outreach Committee; the Hispanic Chamber of Commerce; the Bay Area Business Roundtable; and the Oakland Black Board of Trade and Commerce.

The District is particularly proud of the number of project-specific outreach events in which the SBP participated. The SBP held 8 Mandatory Pre-bid Outreach events presenting 12 projects valued at approximately \$488M (see Chart 1 on p. 6). The SBP also held Semiannual Outreach events for 90 upcoming projects valued at approximately \$900M. 2012 was a great year, and we look for greater improvement in 2013.

The SBP's advocacy work was a phenomenal success. The annual Procurement Fair to benefit small businesses netted \$3,355,748, which was a new record for District 4 (see Chart 2 on p. 9). In addition, the SBP continued tracking the participation of SBEs who were identified as winning bidders on certain projects, with the goal of letting the SBE subcontractors know when they are to begin work on the project and whom to contact.

Last year, SBP hosted 2 events related to the 2012 Disparity Study, which began in October 2011 and was completed in August 2012. In May, D4 hosted a Qualitative Public Forum, moderated by Robert Padilla and Anna Silva from the HQ Office of Business and Economic Opportunity. Then, in September, D4 hosted a Public Participation Hearing for the 2012 Disparity Study, moderated by Anna Silva.

Throughout the year, SBP worked with HQ and other districts and within D4 to streamline coordination and oversight. As a result of this hard work, D4 was the recipient of the SB Advocate Innovation Award (SBAIA) from the DGS-sponsored State Agency Recognition Awards (SARA). District 4 is very proud of this award.

The District 4 Small Business Program looks forward to building on the work done so far in 2012 and surpassing these achievements in the future.

SMALL BUSINESS TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

SBTRC BONDING EDUCATION PROGRAM



From April 18th to June 6th, SBP Manager George Crosby represented Caltrans at the Bonding Education Program (BEP) sponsored by the Small Business Transportation Resource Center (SBTRC). Mr. Crosby spoke at each of the 8 weekly workshops, discussing the D4 SBP's purpose and services available to promote marketing to government. Moreover, he assisted in providing supportive information related to the scheduled topics. The BEP is an inter-agency program collaboration among the SBTRC, Caltrans, and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC). The program's purpose is to educate contractors on bonding processes and requirements, as well as provide resources to help contractors become bondable. The workshops were held at the MTC, with the exception of one held at D4 District Office. The lead presenters varied, but the primary facilitator was Scott Leslie, the Western SBTRC Representative. There were more than 40 participants on average and the information was well-received, according to participant feedback.

SMALL BUSINESS COMMUNITY OUTREACH

BUSINESS MATCHMAKING



On February 23rd, D4's SBP attended this year's Business Matchmaking (BMM) procurement event. The event was held at the Santa Clara Convention Center with the purpose of providing face-to-face procurement opportunities for the small business community with various government, private, and public works agencies. The keynote speakers were founder Chuck Ashman; Vice-President Michael Nicholas; and former State Small Business Advocate Marty Keller. D4 SBP Liaisons Osayahde Nesbitt and Yolanda Larkins represented the district in the face-to-face procurement interviews. They assessed the scope of products and services the participants offered and provided them with referrals to the appropriate Caltrans buyers. The 400 attendees were approximately 100 more than the previous year.

ASSEMBLYMAN PAUL FUNG'S SMALL BUSINESS EXPO



On March 23rd, D4's SBP represented the district at Assemblyman Paul Fung's Small Business Expo held at the Quinlan Community Center in Cupertino. Mr. Fung was the keynote speaker. The Expo's primary purpose was to promote small business opportunities with state and local government agencies, small business networking, and community partnerships. Mr. Crosby sat on a panel and later maintained an informational booth for attendees at the event. There were approximately 200 people in attendance.

BOC - HCC PROCUREMENT FORUM



On June 19th, D4's SBP represented the district at the Business Outreach Committee (BOC) Procurement Forum held in San Francisco. The event was sponsored by the San Jose Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (HCC). The forum was organized to provide face-to-face networking for small business with procurers

for various local and state agencies. The lead facilitator was Maria Aguilar of the BOC - HCC, while Mr. Crosby maintained an informational booth. The event was well attended, with over 200 participants.

BAY AREA BUSINESS ROUNDTABLE



The SBP attended the Business Roundtable sponsored by the Bay Area Business Roundtable (BABRT) on March 29th. Bay Area Business Roundtable is a non-partisan public policy research and advocacy organization that provides leadership with information and analysis on the critical issues facing economics, business and labor, local, state, and federal governments.

OAKLAND BLACK BOARD OF TRADE AND COMMERCE

Mr. Crosby represented the District at the Oakland Black Board of Trade and Commerce event on August 10th at the Waterfront Hotel in Oakland. The purpose of the event was to provide State budget information and to address concerns about the impact of the State budget on the community and its small businesses. The guest speakers discussed various risks facing small business if a budget resolution was not reached. There were approximately 180 attendees, and the information was well-received.

DBE CERTIFICATION WORKSHOP



On October 16th, the SBP hosted a DBE Certification Workshop. The workshop's purpose was to provide current and potential DBE applicants with certification information and face-to-face assistance with their DBE applications. The event was a collaboration of the District 4 Small Business Council (SBC), the Statewide SBC, and Caltrans. The SBP's partnership efforts were designed to help vendors streamline the application process and to prevent or resolve common application errors, which delay processing. Similar events were conducted in the other 11 districts. There were approximately 30 vendors who attended, most of whom gave positive feedback and the event's importance to the community.

PROJECT-SPECIFIC OUTREACH

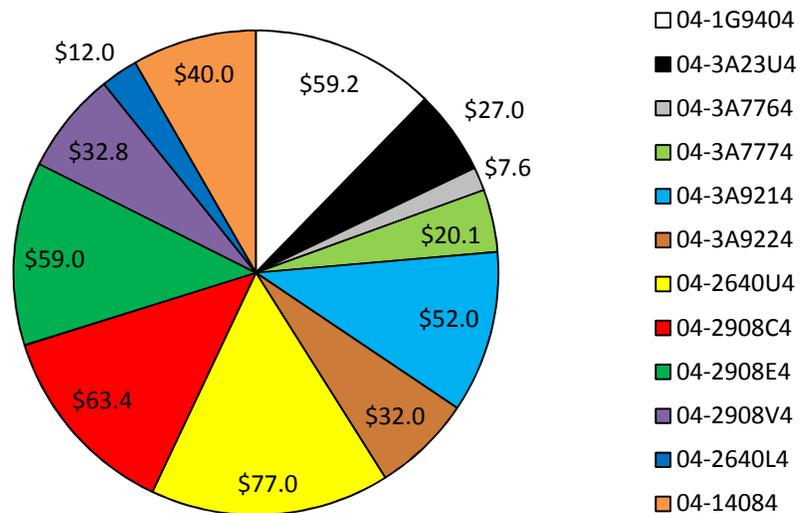
MANDATORY PRE-BID OUTREACH EVENTS

District 4 SBP held 8 Mandatory Pre-bids for 12 construction projects throughout the Bay Area, valued at approximately \$488M. A year ago, all Pre-bids were held in Oakland due to budgetary constraints. This year, the SBP has created partnerships with various counties, making it possible to hold D4's Pre-bids at City Halls, enabling the SBP to hold the Pre-bids near project locations at no cost to the State. This has attracted local businesses which can market themselves to the Primes based on location. The

SBP has seen many new faces of those not able or willing to travel to the Oakland meetings. The SBP will continue to explore new alternatives to be able to reach more businesses in the areas served.

On April 2nd, the SBP held the first Mandatory Pre-bid of the year at the Antioch Community Center for Project 04-1G9404. The project is located in Antioch on State Route 4 in Contra Costa. It is for the construction of retaining and sound walls, freeway widening, and reconstruction of the A Street undercrossing. The state-funded project is valued at \$59.2M and came in under the engineer’s estimate. It was awarded to Bay Cities and CC Myers as a joint venture for \$52.2M. The JV has a DVBE claimed participation of 2.10% (\$1.098M). There are 11 subs, 3 of whom have a SBE certification. There were approximately 10 primes and 13 subs in attendance. The project is currently under construction and is expected to be completed on July 31, 2015.

On July 12th, a Mandatory Pre-bid was held at the Permit and Resource Management Department Building in Santa Rosa for Project 04-3A23U4, valued at \$27M and awarded to Ghilotti Construction Co. for \$28.7M. This state-funded project is located on Route 101 in Sonoma and is for the construction of 4 sound walls in the Town of Windsor. The project has a total claimed DVBE participation of 1.8% (\$514K). There were 5 primes and 10 subs in attendance. Work on the project has not yet begun.

On July 16th, a Mandatory Pre-bid was held for Projects 04-3A7764 and 04-3A7774 (both state-funded) at the Civic Center Plaza in Richmond. Project 04-3A7764 on Alameda 80, valued at \$7.6M, is for the widening and installation of a ramp metering system. The project came in under the engineer’s estimate and was awarded to the only bidder, Taber Construction, for \$5.9M. The contract had no SBE or DVBE goals. However, Taber has listed 6 subs of which 3 are certified SBEs. Work on the project has not yet begun.

Project 04-3A7774 also on Alameda 80 is valued at \$20.1M and is for the installation of overhead sign structures and traffic operations systems. It came in under the engineer’s estimate and was awarded to Peterson-Chase General Engineering Construction, Inc. for \$13.49M. Peterson-Chase’s total claimed DVBE participation on the contract is 1.88% (\$253,532), and the total claimed SBE participation was

7.8% (\$1,064,972). There were 4 primes and 14 subs in attendance at the Pre-bid. Work on the project has not yet begun.

On July 25th, a Mandatory Pre-bid was held for Projects 04-3A9214 and 04-3A9224 (both state-funded) at the DGS Building in Oakland. Project 04-3A9214 on Alameda 880, valued at \$52M, is for the construction of one HOV lane and reconstruction of sound walls. The project was awarded to RGW Construction for \$39.3M. Although the project had no SBE or DVBE goals, RGW claimed a total DVBE participation of 0.09% (\$38,740) and an SBE participation of 0.4% (\$160,130). Work on the project has begun, and it is expected to be completed by October 2015.

Project 04-3A9224, located on Alameda 880, is valued at \$32M and had a \$250K DVBE participation incentive. The project is for the construction of 1 HOV lane, reconstruction of a sound wall, and a ramp metering system. RGW Construction was the lowest bidder on the project at \$20.76M. RGW claimed a DVBE participation of 0.096% (\$20,000) and an SBE participation of 2.24% (\$464,020). This Pre-bid drew great interest from prime contractors. There were 19 primes and 11 subs in attendance. Work on this project has not yet begun.

On July 26th, the Mandatory Pre-bid for Project 04-2640U4 (state-funded) was held at the Petaluma Community Center. The project, valued at \$77M, is for the replacement of the Petaluma River Bridge in Sonoma. The project has not been awarded, but the apparent low bidder is Ghilotti Bros. in a joint venture with CC Myers. The bid came under the engineer's estimate at \$72M; there are no SBE or DVBE goals. However, Ghilotti and CC Myers have committed to 0.02% (\$14,250) DVBE participation. They have also listed 14 subs, of which 4 are certified as SBEs. There were 10 primes and 16 subs in attendance at the Pre-bid. Work has not yet begun as the bid results are preliminary.

On August 2nd, the SBP held a Mandatory Pre-bid for three projects: 04-2908C4, 04-2908E4 and 04-2908V4. All 3 projects are located in Alameda County off Highway 580. These projects are for widening the median area to provide an HOV lane. Project 04-2908C4 (federally- funded) is valued at \$63.4M. The contract has a DBE Goal of 7%. Ghilotti Construction Co. Inc was the lowest bidder at \$53.1M, with at total claimed DBE participation of 14% (\$7.4M). Ghilotti has also listed 10 subs, of which 4 are certified as SBEs. Work on this project is expected to begin on April 2013.

Project 04-2908E4 (federally-funded) is valued at \$59M and has a DBE Goal of 8%. The contract was awarded to De Silva Gates Construction as the lowest bidder at \$38.5M. De Silva has a total DBE claimed participation of 10.52% (\$4,053,940) and have listed 15 subs, 8 of which have an SBE certification. Construction on this project has not yet begun.

Project 04-2908V4 (state-funded) is valued at \$32.8M and has a DVBE participation incentive of \$250K. OC Jones and Sons, Inc. was the lowest bidder at \$27.5M and had a total claimed participation of 1% (\$276,553) as well as a SBE participation of 7.7% (\$2,123,243). Work on this project is scheduled to begin by April 2013. The Pre-bid had an attendance of 11 primes and 11 subs.

On September 5th, a Mandatory Pre-bid was held for Project 04-2640L4 (state-funded) at the DGS Building in Oakland. The project, located in Marin County, is to place an HMA base, construct a bridge

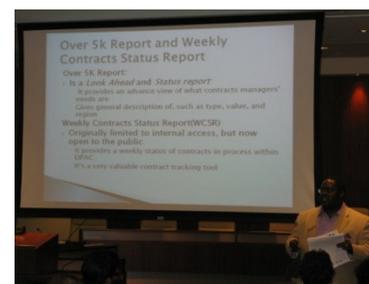
and install rails. Project 04-2640L4, valued at \$12M, came in over the engineer's estimate at \$12,422,485 and was awarded to Ghilotti Bros. and R M Harris as a joint venture. The JV claimed a DBVE participation of 0.81% (\$98,732) and listed an additional 11 subs, 6 of them certified as SBEs. The Pre-bid had 5 primes and 8 subs in attendance. Construction on this project has not yet begun.

On November 19th, the last Mandatory Pre-bid of the year for Project 04-14084 (state-funded) was held at the DGS Building in Oakland. This project is for the construction of the SFOBB Maintenance Complex in Alameda County. It is valued at \$40M, and it has a DVBE participation incentive up to \$250K. The project is currently being advertised on the OE website, with a bid opening day of 1/16/2013. The Pre-bid was very well attended, considering that Caltrans does not have too many projects for the construction of buildings. There were 11 primes and 26 subs in attendance.

SEMIANNUAL OUTREACH EVENTS

On April 12th, the D4 SBP held its first Semiannual Outreach for primes, subs, Small Businesses and DVBEs. In an attempt to encourage new businesses to attend, the SBP has alternated the event locations. This particular one was held at the Richmond City Hall. Approximately 50 construction projects valued at \$750M were presented, as well as the proposed service contracts valued at \$250K and under, which are targeted specifically for small businesses. There were 28 subs in attendance.

On November 7th, a second Semiannual Outreach was held at the DGS Building in Oakland. Approximately 40 projects valued at \$150M to be advertised within the next 4 months were presented. The SBP also added a new topic of interest for the A&E contractors. The previous outreach events tended to focused on mostly construction projects that were already designed and ready to build, but A&E contractors were interested in design and consulting services. Therefore, the SBP decided to include a presentation by the D4 A&E and Consulting Services Unit targeting this group of people. The presentation included information on Caltrans Professional Services Contract and Procurement Methods as well as upcoming A&E contracts. It was a fresh new topic that was very

well-received by all the attendees. The SBP achieved a higher attendance of A&E contractors than in the past due to the A&E presentation. There were 28 subs and 3 primes in attendance.

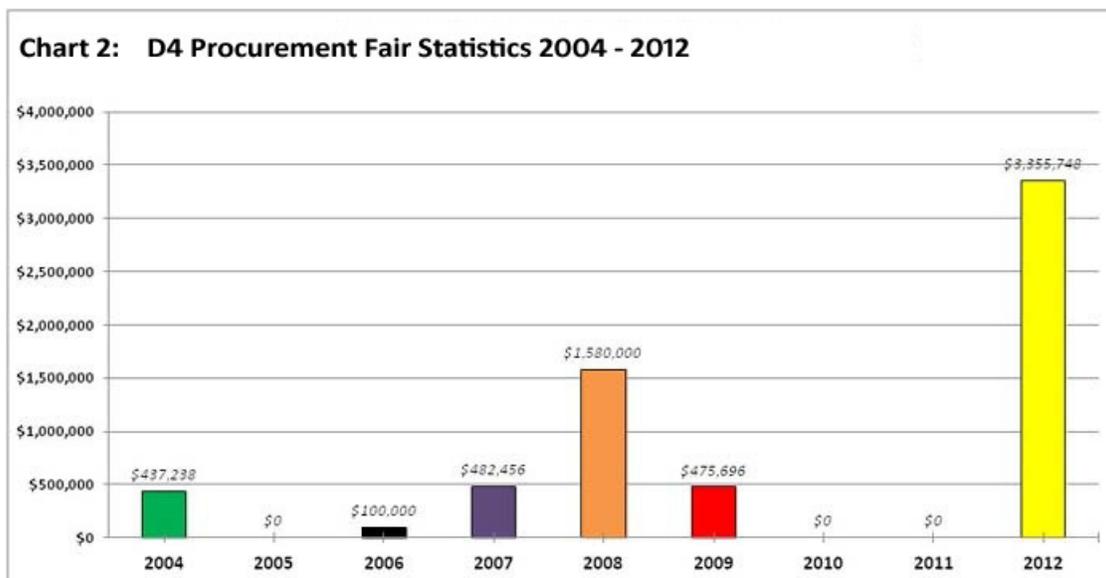
ADVOCACY

CONSTRUCTION PROJECT TRACKING

In February of 2011, the D4 SBP began tracking the participation of SBEs who were identified as winning bidders on the projects. The SBP is currently tracking 3 projects: 1) EA #04-264144 is a \$35.6M road widening project for construction of two additional lanes on Highway 12 in Napa County. This was awarded to Ghilotti Construction Company. The contract is federally-funded and has a 6% DBE goal. 2) EA #04-264134 is a \$21M project for road widening and construction of retention walls on Highway 12 in Napa County. This was awarded to Ghilotti Brothers, Inc. The contract has a UDBE goal of 8%. 3) EA #04-1G9404 is a \$52M road widening project on State Route 4 (SR-4) in Antioch. The project will widen the freeway to 8 lanes and reconstruct the A Street under-crossing and retaining and sound walls. It was awarded to Bay Cities Pavement and CC Myers (JV). The contract has a DVBE commitment of 2.1%. The goal of tracking is to let the SBE subcontractors know when they are to begin work on the project and whom to contact, such as resident engineers, contractors, and project managers. The SBP hopes that facilitating communication and cooperation among all parties will enhance the value of partnerships and further develop relationships.

ANNUAL PROCUREMENT FAIR

On April 4, 2012 the District, in conjunction with the Port of Oakland, held its Annual Procurement Fair at the Jack London Aquatic Center in Oakland. The event was hosted by the Port of Oakland. At the fair



were representatives from virtually every Division. Over 1500 small business vendors and service contractors were invited to the fair to meet the Caltrans buyers. There was an amazing turnout: over 150 representatives from various local businesses attended the event. The businesses were prepared to provide competitive pricing to D4's buyers. They provided free samples and were very appreciative for the opportunity to meet their end consumers. The SBP is proud to state that this year the Procurement Fair generated \$3,355,748.00 (see Chart 2) in purchases from primarily Local Small Businesses, finding this to be a remarkable accomplishment in these economic times. The District will continue with its efforts to have these events annually.

HOSTED EVENTS

DISTRICT 4 SMALL BUSINESS COUNCIL MEETINGS

The purpose of the District 4 Small Business Council (SBC) is to provide a forum for small business trade associations to comment and provide feedback on Caltrans policies and practices that affect or impact small business utilization and participation in Caltrans contracts and projects. Attendance ranges from 19 – 26 people per meeting. In 2012, the D4 SBC met every other month. Reports are located at <http://www.dot.ca.gov/dist4/smallbusiness/sbc.htm>. The SBP prepares the meeting folders and coordinates the council members to ensure that there is a quorum. The SBP also assists in answering council member questions via action items. This year, the SBP responded to action items aimed at improving the effectiveness of outreach to small businesses.

2012 DISPARITY STUDY



The year, D4 hosted two events related to the 2012 Disparity Study, which began in October 2011 and was completed in August 2012. On May 8th, the D4 SBP assisted HQ in facilitation of a Qualitative Public Forum, as part of the 2012 Disparity Study conducted by BBC Research and Consulting. The event was held at the D4 Oakland Office. The primary spokespersons were Robert Padilla and Anna Silva of the Office of Business and Economic Opportunity. Prime contractors, educators, and community members

offered official testimony related to their experiences and concerns related to contract opportunities with state government. The forum had 36 attendees. On September 24th, D4 hosted a Public Participation Hearing, which was moderated by Anna Silva. Both events provided important chances for community input. The Disparity Study has been submitted to FHWA and is awaiting initiation.

COORDINATION AND OVERSIGHT

DSBL STATEWIDE CONFERENCE CALLS

Mr. Crosby participates in the monthly District Small Business Liaison (DSBL) conference call. This allows HQ and all districts to report the updates and activities of their individual programs. Ideas and best practices are exchanged and discussed.

REPORT TO THE EXECUTIVE STAFF

On the first Monday of each month, Mr. Crosby reports any activities and updates regarding the SBP to the Executive Staff. This enables District 4's leadership to stay current on important issues and projects, as well as to ask questions and gather information.

In November, the SBP attended the 2012 State Agency Recognition Awards (SARA), an annual event hosted and sponsored by DGS. This year D4 was the recipient of the SB Advocate Innovation Award (SBAIA), presented by Barbara Vohryzek, Deputy Director and Small Business Advocate, Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development. This award honors D4's best practices, creativity, and outstanding achievements in the advancement of California's Small Business and Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise (DVBE) programs. 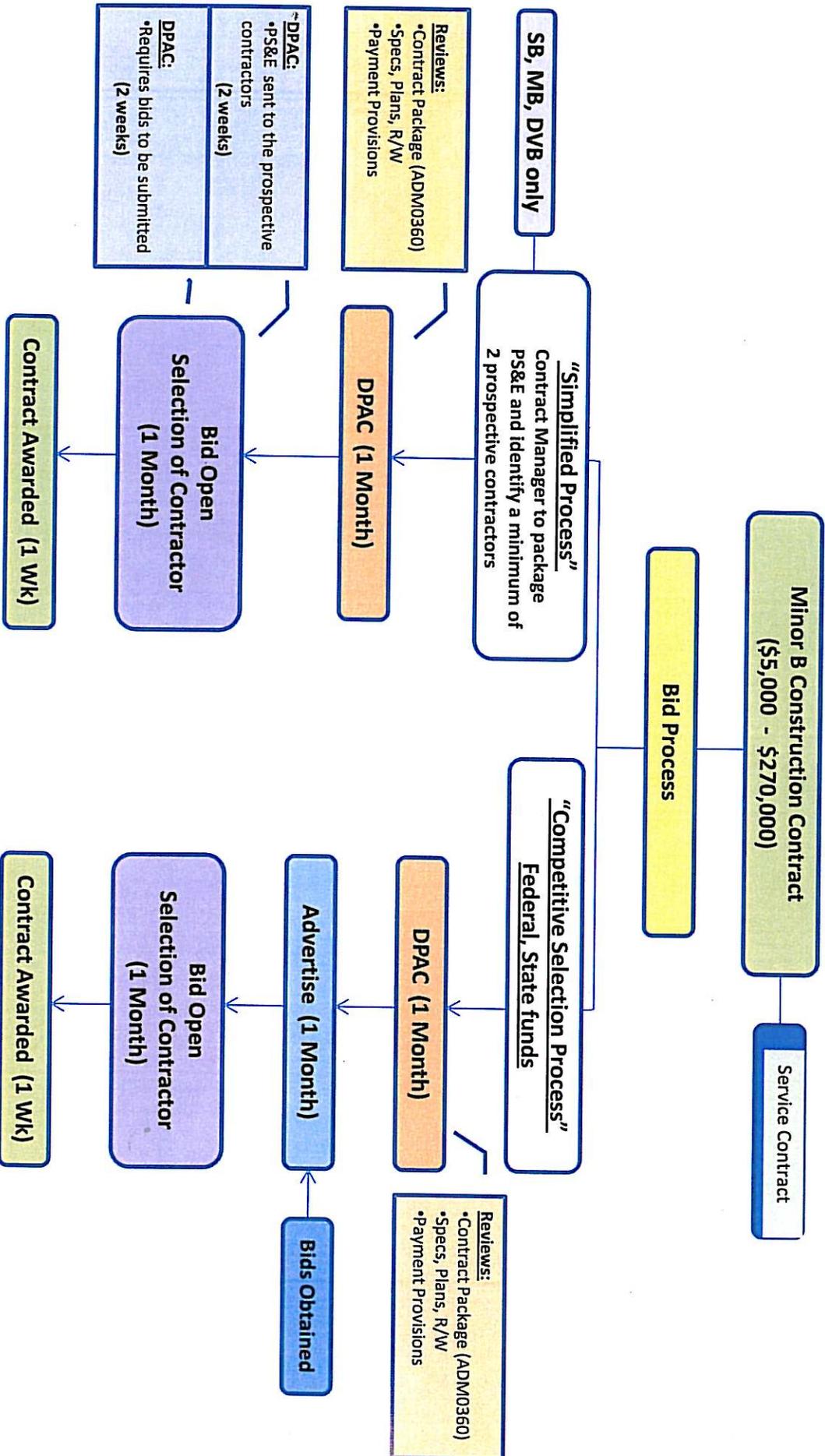

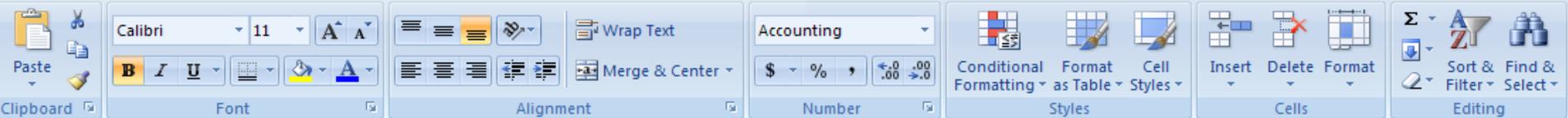
