

This brochure will help travelers navigate in, around, and through Santa Rosa during construction to widen US 101.

California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has begun a major construction project to widen US 101 from four to six lanes between Route 12 and Steele Lane in Santa Rosa. The new lanes will be northbound and southbound carpool lanes, which will add capacity and encourage ridesharing in this congested corridor.

In addition, improvements will include:

- Improved on-ramps from westbound and eastbound Route 12 to northbound and southbound US 101
- Steele Lane widened to three lanes in each direction under the US 101 overpass
- A collector-distributor road on northbound US 101 between Route 12 and 3rd Street
- Santa Rosa Creek Bridge replaced
- A new undercrossing at 6th Street
- College Avenue undercrossing replaced
- Retaining walls and soundwalls at various locations

A construction project of this magnitude can not be accomplished without some impact to the motoring public. There will be detours and closures of the local roads and on/off ramps for safety of the motoring public in and around the construction zones. However, upon completion, traffic congestion will be eased and highway safety improved.

This is a great time to try alternate forms of travel or commuting:

- Public Transportation - Santa Rosa CityBus, Sonoma County Transit and Golden Gate Transit.
- Carpooling/Ridesharing
- Telecommuting
- Modified Work Schedule: Start earlier or later to miss heavy commute times.
- Ride your bike or walk. It is great exercise.

TRAVEL TIPS

- Obey the posted speed limits.
- Expect the unexpected.
- Watch for workers.
- Avoid distractions such as using mobile phones while driving.
