

Purpose:

This segment of the State Route (SR) 46 Expressway Projects is located in and near Lost Hills and was designed to help further increase the safety of this Interregional Corridor as well as improve overall traffic operations. This project will increase the capacity of the existing facility and will thereby reduce congestion, improve traffic operations and improve traffic safety by widening this segment of State Route 46.

Description:

The project is located in Kern County on State Route 46 near Lost Hills, from Lost Hills Road to just east of Interstate-5. This project proposes the widening of State Route 46 from a 2-lane conventional highway to a 4-lane conventional with 22-foot median throughout the project limits. Existing intersections within the project limits would also be upgraded to accommodate STAA (Surface Transportation Act of 1982) trucks.

Construction Cost: \$24 Million

Begin Construction: Fall 2017


End Construction: Fall 2020
