Dear Sirs:

This letter is in response to the spirit and intent of the Roberti Law in the sale of the homes on the 710 corridor:

- The 30-year covenant is extremely excessive (Cal Trans has purchased these homes since the 60s and 70s) and places Caltrans first on the deed which will prevent me from getting a loan to buy my home. This goes against the intent of the Roberti Bill. This will prevent me from obtaining a real estate loan thereby denying qualified "Affordable Tenants" the ability to exercise their rights under the Roberti Bill.
- With a 30-year covenant, there should be an offset of time for each year of tenancy.
- Some percentage of credit (towards offered price) should be given for rent already paid
- Extended family members, regardless of income, not currently residing in the home can purchase the home for their family member who is residing in the home on their behalf.
- If the tenant (new owner of home) passes away he/she can will the deed/property to the co-signer or family member who would then inherit the remainder amount of covenant restriction time (no more than 10 years)
- Covenants should be for Non-Profits and Investors only.
- There should be NO restrictions on a buyer's ability to maintain and improve their property.

- Disagree with the way that Cal Trans is labeling tenants as "not in good standing." For example there are cases in which tenants may have fallen behind on rent due to mitigating circumstances such as loss of employment, illness, and death.
- A 120- day response time (versus 60 day response) to an affordable offer should be changed. This would allow ample time to find a lender.

I would ask that you sincerely, consider my request in the future purchase of my home. I have been a loyal rental tenant with Cal Trans, and I have been part of this community and neighborhood for many years. In the spirit and intent of the Roberti Law and APA Law, it is my hope that I remain part of this community until I die.
