Dear Mr. Fong:

Enclosed for your approval is the California Department of Transportation's (Department) Federal Highway Administration Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) overall goal and methodology for Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2007.

The Department is proposing an overall DBE goal of 10.5 percent for the FFY 2007 to be obtained through race-neutral measures. As you know, the Department did not have sufficient evidence of discrimination or its effects as required by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeal decision to achieve the overall DBE goal through race-conscious measures or a mixed race-conscious/race-neutral goal.

The Department is conducting a disparity study to identify and define the existence and scope of discrimination in California's transportation contracting industry. The results of the disparity study will help the Department to determine what percent of California's statewide DBE goal may be obtained by the use of race conscious measures, such as individual contract goals.
