
LEGISLATIVE UPDATE




LEGISLATIVE HISTORY OF SSTIA

- 1979 - Enacted as AB 120
- 1990 - Mandated insurance study terminated by SB 2374
- 2002 - Reporting to Caltrans repealed by AB 2647




LEGISLATIVE HISTORY of TDA

- 1971 - Enacted
- 1998 - Amendment of citizen participation process by AB 2132
- 2007 - AB 1637 would have changed reimbursement practices and would have allowed public transit to provide NEMT. Did not pass.




PROPOSED NEW FREEDOM EXPANSION

- Existing: The New Freedom Program (49 USC § 5317) funds are available to public transportation service providers whose services go beyond those required by the ADA, which are:
 - New public transportation, or
 - New alternatives to public transportation




PROPOSED NEW FREEDOM EXPANSION

- The service is identified in the locally developed, coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan;
- The service is designed to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities;
- The service removes barriers to transportation and assists persons with disabilities with transportation;
- The service was not operational on August 10, 2005, and did not have an identified funding source as of August 10, 2005, as evidenced by inclusion in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) or the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP); and
- The service is not designed to allow an agency to meet its obligations under the ADA or the DOT ADA implementing regulations.




PROPOSED NEW FREEDOM EXPANSION

- Examples of projects that would be eligible for New Freedom funds include:
 - Fixed route service extended to serve a congregate living facility or a workplace serving large numbers of individuals with disabilities.
 - New or expanded demand responsive service, including new hours or days of operation, or increased geographic coverage, to meet the needs of individuals with disabilities.




ADA SUMMARY REVISION

- Now includes a section on the New Freedom Program (49 USC § 5317) explaining that funds are available to public transportation service providers whose services go beyond those required by the ADA.




TDA SUMMARY REVISION

- Now includes a section on the "unmet transit needs" process
- Before making the allocation of funds for specified purposes, the transportation planning agency has to
- consult with the social service transportation advisory council,
- identify the transit needs of the jurisdiction,
- and identify unmet transit needs of the jurisdiction that are reasonable to meet.
- The term "unmet transit needs" not defined in state law.




TDA SUMMARY REVISION

- "Unmet transit needs" process
 - Public hearing
 - Resolution
 - 1)there were no unmet transit needs;
 - 2)there were no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet; or
 - 3) there are unmet transit needs, including needs that are reasonable to meet.
 - If it is found that there are no unmet transit needs or they are unreasonable, the transportation planning agency may give the funds to a county or city for streets or roads.






TECHNICAL UPDATE: SUBCOMMITTEE MTG: INTERREGIONAL GAP ANALYSIS

- Subcommittee Meeting Summary (Handout)




SUBCOMMITTEE MEETING ACTION ITEMS

- The project team will provide status reports on the progress of Coordinated Plan review and development of the Statewide Executive Summary at future MAP PAC meetings.




STAKEHOLDER INVOLVEMENT: INTERVIEW AND DISCUSSION THEMES

- Regional Perspectives on Priorities designed to facilitate coordination of Transportation through a State-Wide Strategic Plan




STAKEHOLDER INVOLVEMENT: EMAIL/TELEPHONE INTERVIEWS

- Referrals from MAP PAC members
- Referrals from regional roundtables and small group discussions
- Will be complementary to legislative fact-finding interviews



STAKEHOLDER INVOLVEMENT: REGIONAL ROUNDTABLES

- Roundtables in 11 geographic regions statewide
 - Stakeholder peer groups (e.g., senior centers, regional centers, CalWorks/GAIN, DPSS, hospitals, etc.) public transit agency/organization representatives, city representatives, etc.
- Validate and potentially supplement information that what we find during Coordinated Plan reviews
- Solicit opinions and perspectives from stakeholders about coordination issues
- Educate and inform stakeholders as needed




STAKEHOLDER INVOLVEMENT: SMALL FOCUSED GROUP DISCUSSIONS
