Coming From Another City?

If your commute is 30-50 miles or more roundtrip, the frustration of long, bumper-to-bumper commutes and skyrocketing gas prices have no doubt hit you! If this sounds like you, no need to worry; there are viable transit solutions for your commute to Downtown Sacramento also.

Amtrak

First, there is the Amtrak Capitol Corridor rail service, which serves Downtown Sacramento from both the east and the west.

The Capitol Corridor provides an attractive alternative to daily gridlock on the highways during commute hours. Once on the train, you can relax in the comfortable seating, read a newspaper or get some extra work done on your way home or to the office.

Park & Ride

Another option is one of the many commuter bus services that connect Sacramento with outlying cities where local transit does not provide service to Sacramento. It's really easy to use too! Local Park & Ride facilities serve as "bus stops" where passengers are picked up and dropped off. Upon arrival to Downtown there are several drop off points that will get you close to your place of employment.
