

**Subject:** 2008 Time Extension on Existing Variance for Aerially Deposited Lead

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) issued a letter on January 31, 2007, to all districts currently holding an aerially deposited lead (ADL) variance and planning to renew it. The letter states that the existing variance for ADL is extended until June 30, 2008. The Department of Transportation is continuing to work with DTSC to renew the variance.
